\* Note that while the above represents all possible courses that might be offered for next year, the school retains the right to not offer a course if insufficient requests are received or a staff member is not available who has the necessary credentials and experience to offer the course in an effective manner.

## **Choosing Your Courses**

- Grade 10 students should choose enough courses to fill all 16 blocks (8 per semester) Full course load required
- Grade 11 students should choose enough courses to fill 14 blocks (7 blocks each semester)
- Grade 12 students should choose enough courses to fill 14 blocks (7 blocks in each semester)
- 5/6 credit courses will fill 2 blocks
- 3 credit courses will fill 1 block
- A typical grade 10 schedule will include: English, Science, Math, Social Studies, P. E., Calm (take up 11 blocks), and enough options to fill another 5 blocks plus at least two alternate option requests.

## Requirements for Receiving an Alberta High School Diploma

One credit represents '25 hours' of class time. For example, courses for which students receive 5 credits involve approximately 125 hours of instruction. Those for which they receive 3 credits involve between 65 and 75 hours of instruction. Math 10 and Science 10 are examples of five credit courses. Design Studies and Religious Ethics 20 are examples of three credit courses. To receive their 5 or 3 credits in these courses a student must attain a mark of at least 50%. Courses are arranged in sequences such as Social Studies 10, 20, 30. A mark of at least 60% is recommended to advance to the next level.

Students achieving a final mark of less than 50% are required to either retake the course or they may continue in the alternate route at the next grade level subject. Students successfully completing this next grade level course earn credits for the course and for its normal prerequisite. See High School Program Guide for alternate routes.

If you have written official music conservatory examinations for private music lessons, you may be eligible for credits for this training. Of course these credits would be "additional" to those you are pursuing through school courses. You should check with the Counselor about specific regulations or exceptions.

To graduate you must have a minimum of 100 credits, including:

- English 30-1 or 30-2.
- Social Studies 30-1 or 30-2.
- Physical Education 10
- Mathematics 20, or 24 or Applied Math 20
- Sciences: a minimum of 10 credits
- CALM 20
- 10 credits from <u>Career and Technologies</u> or <u>Fine Arts</u> or <u>Second Languages</u>.
- 10 credits in any 30 level courses in addition to English and Social Studies

All students of Edmonton Christian School Senior High are also required to take:

- 6 credits in Religious Studies (3 credits from Religious Ethics and 3 credits from World Religions)
- Ideally students would also take CALM at ECS HS as this allows for participation in the Big Brothers- Big Sisters mentoring program as well as provides students with the prerequisites for participation in Work Experience or the RAP program.
